Undergraduate Scholarship

The University of Utah's Entrada Field Station is an outdoor laboratory located along the Dolores River in southeastern Utah eight miles upstream from its junction with the Colorado River (1 hour from Moab). The mission of the Station is to promote and inspire scholarly work, learning, and academic-community partnerships on a broad-range of topics related to Colorado Plateau ecosystems.

The Entrada Advisory Committee solicits applications for scholarships intended to provide University of Utah undergraduates with an opportunity to engage in studies associated with the Station. The fellowship is open to **ANY** project from **ANY** discipline, but preference will be given to projects that contribute to a baseline understanding of the land, including scientific studies such as plant and/or animal surveys, geomorphology surveys, oral histories of descendents of the original homesteaders, a history of ranching activities in the area, archaeology and/or a history of Native American uses of the land, literary or visual works that reflect upon the land, etc.

Applicants must work with a faculty mentor, but some degree of independence in project development and completion will count in the applicant's favor. Work may take place at the Entrada Field Station or at the University of Utah.

Awards (up to \$1,000) are to be used for supplies and/or travel (including per diem). Funds may not be used for stipends, travel to meetings, or tuition.
